### Easter pop-up card

Amaze your friends and family this year, or perhaps even your teacher, by making one of these egg-cellent Easter pop-up cards and sending them with a special message inside!

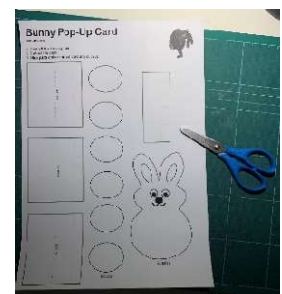
## What equipment will you need?

- The bunny pop-up template
- Scissors
- Glue
- Colouring pencils/pens

## How to do it

### Step 1 ⚠

Carefully cut out all of the parts from the bunny pop-up template provided.



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### Step 2

Decorate all of the parts. Add your own egg designs and use bright colours to make them stand out against your card. Colour in the bunny also. Give him some clothes or leave him as is – it's up to you!



### Step 3

Glue grass strands to green paper and cut them out. Fold on the line and then cut out the slits to make the grass.



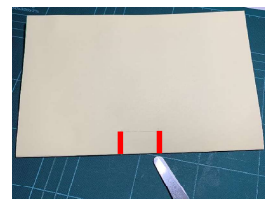
### Step 4

Glue the green paper to one side of the card. Next, fold the card so that the green paper is on the inside.



### Step 5

Use the bunny grass part to find the slot line and place in the middle of the card. Draw round the part with a pencil and cut 2 slits.



### Step 6

Fold the flap over on the outside. Open up the card and push the flap to the inside to make a step.

### Step 7

To make the sky draw a wavy line on the blue paper and cut out the shape. Glue this to the inside of the card to make the sky.



### Step 8

Glue the bunny grass part to the bunny. Put glue on the flap and stick on the bunny.

### Step 9

Glue the grass stands and eggs onto the card.

### Step 10

Fold over the parts and close the card. You can now add your own design to the front of your card.



**Well done – your Easter pop-up card should now be complete!**



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### Easter fun

After all that hard work, here are some cracking jokes to make you smile:

### Fun Easter facts

- Chocolate is poisonous to cats and dogs
